AFFIDAVIT

The undersigned, being first duly sworn, states as follows:

1. My father, Kenneth H. Blaisdell, Jr. suffered a stroke in July of 2013 and from then until his death required care which was provided substantially by myself and my husband.
2. At the time, there was no compensation for this care as my father did not have liquid assets available to pay for the care and to continue the agricultural operations and commercial gravel operations. However, in family discussions it was always our expectation to be paid on his death. My father also made it clear that he did not want to be placed in a care facility.
3. My father died on April 10, 2021. His Will dated, December 16, 2008 nominated my brother, Thad Blaisdell as Executor. Since my father's death, my brother has not filed any documentation to open the Estate.
4. Since my father's death I have advanced substantial funds on behalf of the Estate to ensure the agricultural business would continue to operate. No income has been received, as of the date of this Affidavit, due to the seasonal nature of the farm.
5. The municipal property tax payment on real estate will be due on October 30, 2021.
6. In conversations with my brother, he has stated that he is in no hurry to open the estate and he had no issue with property taxes being late on the properties. In regards to expenses of the Estate, my brother said that we could forward the expenses to him to determine what he would pay and that we would have to wait a long time before we would be reimbursed for our advancements to pay Estate expenses.
7. My brother has stated several times that continuing the operations and any reimbursement to me or my family would not be in the best interest of the Estate and we could just "squirm for a while".

8. My brother has also expressed personal animosity towards me, claiming that he would spend all of the Estate assets contesting my claim for compensation for the care provided to my father.
9. My brother has not recognized the validity of our claims for compensation for the care provided to my father, in spite of his prior approval for performance of caregiving services.
10. My brother is a beneficiary of 50% of the residuary estate and would benefit from the disallowance of any claim which we will present in connection with my father's care.
